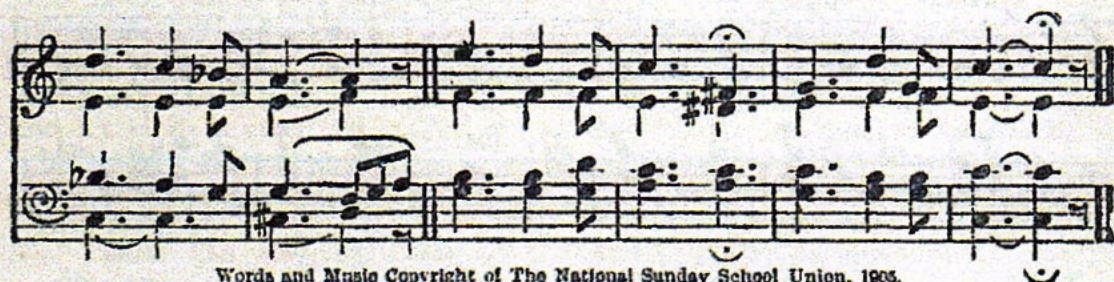


STORIES OF JESUS.

Of bitter pain ;  
And of the Cross where my Saviour  
For me was slain :  
Sad ones or bright ones,  
So that they be,  
Stories of Jesus,
